2024 COMPETITION CATEGORIES FOR WOODCARVERS

ALL SKILL LEVELS

Please read each level carefully to determine what skill level you belong in:

REQUIREMENTS

Once a Best of Show Award has been received or if you earn three blue ribbons (won at our shows) in your current category, you must automatically move to the next skill level. You have the option to move up to the next skill level at your own discretion, except for the master level. Judges reserve the right to relocate entry to a different category or skill level.

NOVICE:

Entry level skills in carving or wood burning and may move up to the intermediate level when ready, **usually within three years, depending on one's skill advancement.** Individual should move up to the intermediate level as stated above in Requirements.

INTERMEDIATE:

Skill level consists of refined sculpting and painting. Individual shows consistent techniques in carving/painting/burning. Individual may move up to advanced level when ready. Individual must move up to the advanced level as started above in Requirements.

ADVANCED:

Individual has reached a mature level in carving/painting/burning. Individual must move up to the master's level as stated above in Requirements.

MASTER:

Advancement to the master level is based upon fulfilling all the above skill levels and winning three first place ribbons or Best of Show at the advanced level. Winning the first-place awards does not require one to move to the master level automatically--the individual must show consistent skill level above the advanced category. Please note that the show judges reserve the final acceptance of category placement when judging the item entered.

A master carver may exit to the advanced level if s/he feels his/her skill has diminished. This also will be approved by the show judges when examining the entry piece. Should the entry receive the Best of Show award at the advanced level, the individual will be reclassified to the master level.

CATEGORIES

Select a category among those below describing the carving entered.

The category number selected must be preceded by the letter N, I, A or M (Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, Master) depending on carver's skill level.

For example, the category for a Novice carver entering a painted wood burning is N6B1:

- (N) Novice
- (6) Category 6
- (B1) Wood burning, painted or natural

Another example, the category for a Master carver entering a painted hawk as M3A3:

- (M) Master
- (3) Category 3
- (A3) Birds of prey, painted or natural

Category I – Animals (excluding birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians)

- 1A1 Domestic/agricultural, painted or natural
- 1A2 Animal heads/busts, painted or natural
- 1B1 Miniature/sub-miniature animals, painted or natural
- 1C1 All other animals, painted or natural

1D1 - Miscellaneous – any animal not fitting other categories, painted or natural

Category 2 – Fish, Aquatic Creatures, Reptiles and Amphibians

- 2A1 Any fish, fresh, saltwater, w/gills to breath, painted or natural
- 2B1 Aquatic creatures, painted or natural
- 2C1 Amphibians and Reptiles, painted or natural
- 2D1 Miniature/sub-miniature aquatic, painted or natural
- 2E1 Miscellaneous aquatics not fitting other categories, painted or natural

<u>Category 3 – Birds/Aviary</u>

- 3A1 Waterfowl, painted or natural
- 3A2 Shorebirds/seabirds, painted or natural
- 3A3 Birds of prey, painted or natural
- 3A4 Game birds, painted or natural
- 3A5 All other birds, painted or natural

3B1 – Decorative smoothies, must be of wood and show realism, creative postures, and decorative painting, painted or natural

3C1 – Miniature/sub-miniature birds, painted or natural

3D1 – Miscellaneous –any birds not fitting any other categories, painted or natural.

Category 4 – Human, Religious Figures, Caricatures

4A1 – Human torso(s), painted or natural

4A2 – Human(s), full bodies, painted or natural

- 4B1 Religious figures, painted or natural
- 4C1 Single caricature figure, painted or natural
- 4C2 Group caricature figures, painted or natural
- 4C3 Bust, head, or mask caricature, painted or natural
- 4D1 Miscellaneous including abstracts, painted or natural

<u>Category 5 – Ornamental and Mythology</u>

- 5A1 Carousel figure(s), painted or natural
- 5B1 Religious motifs, emblems, symbols, painted or natural
- 5C1– Mythological (fantasy, extinct, Santa figures, kahunas) painted or natural
- 5D1 Flowers, painted or natural
- 5E1 Miscellaneous ornamental or mythological, painted or natural

Category 6 – Chip Carving, Wood Burning, Gourds, and Bark Carving

- 6A1 Chip carving, painted or natural (excludes canes)
- 6B1 Wood burning, painted or natural
- 6B2 Wood burning, on surfaces other than wood, painted or natural
- 6C1 Gourds, carved and/or burned, painted or natural
- 6D1 Architectural bark carving
- 6D2 All other bark carvings

<u>Category 7 – Relief Carving</u> – PLEASE NOTE - all relief carvings are under Category 7

7A1 – Animal(s), painted or natural

7B1 – Fish, aquatic creatures, etc., painted or natural

7C1 – Bird(s), painted or natural

7D1 – Human, single/group, painted or natural

7E1 – Architectural – Buildings, bridges, acanthus, etc., painted or natural

7F1 – Landscape, seascape, flowers, painted or natural

7G1 - Miscellaneous not categorized elsewhere, painted or natural

<u>Category 8 – All Other/Miscellaneous</u>

8A1 – Canes or walking sticks, painted or natural, including chip carving, painted or natural

8B1 – Intarsia – not from kits – painted or natural

8C1 – Classroom, roughouts, or instructor-assisted, painted or natural

8D1 – Miscellaneous – not categorized elsewhere, painted or natural
